



Newwave Communications, the City's cable provider, has been busy since the ice storm, and they report the following:

We responded quickly to the Ice Storm of 2009, but since it was an extraordinary storm, we have taken the following steps to improve our preparedness and system performance.

Installed/replaced/upgraded all hub site power back up power

- Generators
- UPS (Universal power supplies)

Upgraded/repaired/replaced 100% of all system power supplies

•If commercial power is interrupted, our system will remain on for several hours allowing us to mobilize portable generators

Purchased several standby generators in event of prolonged commercial power outages

- Portable for on site power supply backup
- NOC (Network Operations Center) upgrade
- Full time staff in Sikeston, MO
- Monitors CPE device counts and imposing weather threats
- Back up powering installed at Call Center/Ops Center
- Secondary NOC location in Atlanta GA established
- Software upgraded to notify via text, e-mail and phone call alerts at point of impact to technical staff
- Currently updating data logs for GPS coordinates to all powering devices relative to critical field electronics
- *Upgraded GPS units in all fleet vehicles to coordinate nearest vehicles to outage for quicker response times

ALWAYS THOUGHT ABOUT RUNNING FOR CITY OFFICES? IT'S THAT TIME!

According to Graves Court Clerk Barry Kennemore, anyone interested in running for city offices can file between November 4, 2009, and the deadline of 4:00pm on January 26, 2010. City races are non-partisan, and the filing fee is \$50.00, and candidates must have two qualified voters to sign their filing papers. Filing is done at Kennemore's offices in the Graves County Courthouse.

For the Mayor's race, the requirements are as follows:

- *candidates must be 25 years of age or older
- *candidates must reside within the city for one year
- *candidates must be a qualified voter in the city, and
- *candidates must reside in the city throughout their term of office

For the City Council race, the requirements are the same, except they must be 21 years of age or older.

In order to have a primary election (which would be held on May 18, 2010), there would have to be three (3) candidates for the Mayor's race, and twenty-one (21) candidates for the city council race. Any numbers lower than these would eliminate a primary election, and go straight to the general election, which would be November 2, 2010.
